- You just spelt out a concept I have been struggling with but couldn't put my finger on. The foregrounding individual resilience is exactly where parts of Vic gov is at the moment
- It's the narrative of climate action recycle your own garbage instead of expecting manufacturing to stop producing it ... Or don't buy items wrap with tons of garbage instead of light packaging
- Servant leadership
- In terms of resilience, it seems that the decoupling of vulnerability and adaptive capacity may also be traced to how vulnerability is defined in relation to risk. The current conception of risk does not account for how systemic inequalities and policies (ie the social context) actually produce vulnerability. Rather, vulnerability is framed in that neoliberal way as a result of personal characteristics (beyond the common human vulnerability we all have).
- Being in the middle of the institutional system...a while ago public service seemed to have a ethos of public service which doesn't feel as emphasised in today's govt systems
- On character, the book How to Win Friends and Influence People by Dale Carnegie is an oldie but a goodie on character ethic (vs personality ethic)
- If leadership and the development of leadership skills are so important, why do we invest so little in it? the (almost) 200,000 volunteer emergency service volunteers around Australia have access to virtually zero meaningful leadership development.
